Discussion Guide

“What’s on the Other Side of Your Faith?”

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Starter Think about one of the biggest decisions you’ve ever had to make. It could have been choosing a school, accepting a job, moving to a new city, starting a relationship, or saying “yes” to something that felt completely outside your comfort zone. What made that decision difficult?

Sermon Summary

Faith often requires us to trust God before we know the outcome, choosing obedience over certainty even when the cost feels high. Through Rahab’s story, this message reveals that one courageous act of faith can transform not only our own lives but also leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.

ACT

As you absorb sermons, read, or participate in group discussion, take notes and make a plan to apply what God’s teaching you.

A (Action): Mark important ideas with an “A” to remind you to take action.

C (Contemplate): Use a “C” to mark ideas you want to process further.

T (Transfer/Teach): If it’s something you need to teach to someone else, note it with a “T.”

Discuss

Choose questions to keep the discussion moving. There’s no need to discuss every question.

1. When have you found yourself at a crossroads where you had to trust God without knowing how everything would turn out?
2. What is one area of your life where you’re waiting for certainty before moving forward in obedience? Why do you think that is?
3. Rahab risked her reputation, safety, and future because she believed God. What comforts or securities are hardest for you to surrender to Him?

4. How have you experienced God proving Himself faithful after you chose obedience instead of fear?
5. Who might be impacted if you faithfully followed God's leading in your current season?

Go Deeper

1. Study [Genesis 12:1–9](#) (Abram leaves his homeland). What familiar place, habit, or sense of security might God be asking you to trust Him with?
2. Study [1 Samuel 17:1–51](#) (David faces Goliath). What “giant” are you tempted to view through fear instead of through God's faithfulness?
3. Study [Matthew 14:22–33](#) (Peter walks on water). What “boat” of comfort or security may be keeping you from fully trusting Jesus?
4. Study [Acts 9:10–19](#) (Ananias obeys God's call). How could your obedience today become part of God's work in someone else's future?

Apply

1. Ask God to identify one area where fear or uncertainty has been keeping you from obedience and choose to trust Him in that area this week.
2. Write down a promise from Scripture that speaks to your current situation and revisit it whenever doubt begins to grow.
3. Share your story of God's faithfulness with someone who may need encouragement to trust Him.
4. Consider how your decisions today could influence your family, friends, or future generations, and choose obedience with that eternal perspective in mind.

Pray

Here are some prayer points:

1. Ask God to replace fear, doubt, and the need for certainty with confidence in His character and His promises.
2. Pray that your faith would become a testimony that encourages and impacts those around you.
3. Ask God to use your obedience to accomplish His purposes in your family, community, and future generations.

Leadership Tip

Encourage your group members to be honest about the fears or uncertainties they face. Rather than encouraging quick solutions, help them listen for what God may be asking them to trust Him with, reminding them that spiritual growth often begins with one faithful act of obedience instead of having every answer. End your time together by inviting members to share one specific way they plan to respond this week and pray for one another to have the courage to follow through.
